## Biblioteket – The Public Library – serving all residents





## What is a Public Library?

A public library is a free service to all residents in Norway. At the public library you can:

- Borrow books, audio books, films, music and games
- Read newspapers and use the Internet
- Access public information
- Meet other children, young people and adults

The primary mission of the public library is to provide all residents of Norway with free access to knowledge and culture. Your local library may also arrange exhibitions, readings and other activities.

## How you can borrow books etc.

All residents of Norway can obtain a library card from the library by showing valid proof of identity. The library card is free and there is no charge on borrowing items from the public library.

Children must have the written approval of their parent(s) or guardian(s) in order to have a library card issued.

You must have your library card with you when you wish to borrow books etc.

There is a small fee for books that are returned late.

If you lose or damage a borrowed book or other article, you must either replace this or pay a fee.

## In your language

The majority of public libraries have a wide range of books and films in Norwegian and English. Many libraries also have a selection of music and games for lending out.

If the library doesn't have what you are looking for in your language, you can ask the staff if they can request it from the Det flerspråklige bibliotek (The Multilingual Library) (DFB). This is free of charge.

At dfb.nb.no you can see what's available. If you have a national library card you may have the option to request loans here yourself. Ask your library if this applies to you.

DFB has books in the following languages: Albanian, Amharic, Arabic, Badini Kurdish, Bosnian, Bulgarian, Burmese, Dari, English, Estonian, French, Hausa, Hindi, Icelandic, Yoruba, Chinese, Croatian, Kurmanji Kurdish, Latvian, Lithuanian, Dutch, Oromo, Punjabi, Pashto, Persian, Polish, Portuguese, Rumanian, Russian, Serbian, Shona, Somali, Sorani Kurdish, Spanish, Swahili, Tagalog, Tamil, Thai, Tigrinja, Czech, Chechen, Turkish, Twi, Ukrainian, Hungarian, Urdu, Vietnamese.

Ask at your library if you require assistance in finding what you are looking for.
